Brass Teaching Artist for BRAVO Cesar Chavez After-school Youth Orchestra and Chorus

Hours: 15 hrs/week, approximately 33 wks annually; 2:45-5:15pm M-F, including weekly staff meetings (an additional 1hr once a week) and instructional preparation time, occasional evenings or weekends (for performances)

Pay rate: \$35/hr teaching rate, \$17.50/hr for additional non-teaching hours (meetings, optional events)

Personal time: 7 hours per year

Sick leave: 1 hour accrued per 30 hours worked in accordance with Portland Protected Sick Time Ordinance

Organization Summary: BRAVO Youth Orchestras is a non-profit organization created to transform the lives of underserved children and youth through intensive, ensemble-based music instruction. BRAVO is inspired by El Sistema, Venezuela's national program of social action through music, and is a member of the National Alliance of El Sistema Inspired Programs. BRAVO launched in September 2013 with a strings and chorus program at Rosa Parks Elementary School and has served over 60 students in grades 2-5. In 2015-16, BRAVO extended the program to grades 4-5 at the César Chávez School. In 2017-2018 school year, this tuition-free, after-school winds and chorus program will serve about 65 wind students in grades 3-7 on flute, clarinet, trumpet and trombone. The programs are located in Portland's most culturally diverse and high priority schools (18 languages spoken, 95% of students qualify for free and reduced lunch). Position Summary:

The BRAVO Brass Teaching Artist serves as a member of a vibrant team of teachers who lead daily sectionals with approximately 10 students in grades 3-5. TAs participate in teaching general musicianship classes and assist their section in full orchestra rehearsals by modeling positive, focused behavior and coaching students. The teaching team meets together at a one-hour, weekly meeting. TAs will also attend and assist at BRAVO performances on a few pre-selected weekends or evenings (advance notice will be given of specific dates). BRAVO's schedule closely follows the public school calendar.

Qualifications:

- Passion for impacting students' lives through music, especially underserved or at-risk youth
- Effective classroom management techniques
- Prior experience teaching school age children
- Mastery of your instrument and strong general music knowledge
- Ability to work well in a racially and culturally diverse community
- Commitment to creating a nurturing atmosphere with evident mutual respect for students, parents/guardians, volunteers, and co-workers
- Punctuality, professionalism, and a commitment to excellence
- Ability to teach trumpet and trombone to beginners

Position Requirements:

- Undergraduate degree in music (Masters degree preferred) or equivalent
- Minimum of 2 years teaching music in individual or group settings
- Successfully pass a background check
